

RESOLUTION 2008-015


A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE PROCEDURES TO ADOPT AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LA PINE.

WHEREAS, the City of La Pine ("City") desires to establish certain procedures that City will follow when adopting City ordinances;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by and through the La Pine City Council meeting in regular session, that the following constitutes the procedures City will adhere to when adopting City ordinances:

1. The enacting clause of all ordinances will be "The City of La Pine ordains as follows:".
2. Except as otherwise provided in Section 3 of this resolution, an ordinance will be fully and distinctly read in open council meeting on two different days before adoption by the council.
3. Except as otherwise provided in Section 4 of this resolution, the council may adopt an ordinance at a single meeting by the unanimous vote of the council members present provided the ordinance is read first in full and then by title.
4. A reading of an ordinance may be by title only if the following conditions are satisfied: (i) no council member present at the reading requests that the ordinance be read in full, or (ii) at least four days before the reading (a) a copy of the ordinance is provided for each council member, (b) three copies of the ordinance are available for public inspection in the office of the custodian of city records, and (c) notice of the ordinance's availability is given by written notice posted at the city hall.
5. An ordinance read by title only has no legal effect if it differs substantially from its terms as it was filed prior to the reading unless each section so differing is read fully and distinctly in an open council meeting before the council adopts the ordinance.
6. Upon the adoption of an ordinance, the ayes and nays of the council members will be entered in the record of the applicable council proceeding.
7. After adoption of an ordinance, (i) the mayor will authenticate the ordinance, and (ii) the custodian of the city records will endorse the ordinance with its date of adoption and the endorser's name and title of office. An ordinance will be given the number following the last preceding ordinance passed.
8. A non-emergency ordinance takes effect on the thirtieth day after its adoption or on such later date the ordinance may prescribe. Each ordinance will identify the effective date of the ordinance. An ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety will take effect immediately upon its adoption (unless a later date is prescribed).
